An inspiring new community larder is in place in Bentswood to help residents in need. The Bentswood Community Larder was the idea of Sussex Clubs for Young People employee, Anna Sharkey, and Town Councillor, Rachel Cromie, and has been



another example of the whole community coming together to support a community project. The new facility has been supported by Clarion Futures, Sussex Clubs for Young People, the Bentswood Community Partnership and Haywards Heath Town Council.

Cllr Rachel Cromie comments, "We started to help deliver food donated from kind members of the community to those families who were struggling during the half term and Haywards Heath Town Council immediately supported us to get the project off the ground. The scheme has grown into something bigger and we now have fresh food and staples each day for those residents who need it the most. The rewarding part of this scheme is that so many people who take something, come back in a few days later and donate something else. It really is a community effort."

Anna Sharkey said, "Not only are we helping people in our community but we are also helping our environment, as a large amount of the food we are handing out would ordinarily end up in landfill. Everything we have received has come from the local community, from local families, local businesses, local organisations and Haywards Heath Town Council. By working together, we have been able to find a sustainable solution to help the local community and combat food waste at the same time"

They help children and parents/carers to resolve problems, develop confidence and resilience and improve relationships. They also provide food parcels, clothing, household goods and help with winter fuel bills where necessary.

You can support the Family Support Work charity by making donations directly to St Richard's Church of non-perishable foodstuffs, toiletries, or games, books and puzzles for children. Even when the church is locked, it is possible to drop donations off, or you can contact them to have these collected.

Hurst Farm Update

Much Needed Community Infrastructure for Haywards Heath

Haywards Heath Town Council welcomes the purchase of land off Hurstwood Lane by Homes England to drive forward the muchneeded development of a new primary school, cemetery, allotments and country park, with the protection of ancient woodland, alongside the need for the allocated housing on Hurst Farm. A direct benefit of Homes England's involvement is a close working relationship which has been forged with the Town Council. This will enable the Town Council to keep residents up to date as the works on the land commence and as the planning application is brought forward towards the end of the year. In the interest of health and safety, Homes England are undertaking remedial works on the land to fulfil their duty of care as landowners and as a start to make the land, that they will develop for the benefit of the Town, fit for purpose and safe.
